1) The document that provides ethical principles to provide guidance to physicians and other participants in medical research involving human subjects is called the Declaration of Helsinki.

2) The main purpose of medical research involving human subjects is to improve understanding of diseases, develop new treatments and therapies, and ultimately improve the health and well-being of individuals.

3) Physicians should immediately stop research involving human subjects if there is evidence of harm or potential harm to the participants, if the study protocol is not being followed, if there are ethical concerns or violations, or if there are unforeseen risks that were not disclosed during the informed consent process.

4) The research subject has the right to give informed consent, to withdraw from the study at any time, to have their privacy and confidentiality protected, and to be treated with respect and dignity.
