1. The document that provides ethical principles to guide physicians and other participants in medical research involving human subjects is the Declaration of Helsinki.
2. The main purpose of medical research involving human subjects is to advance scientific knowledge, improve medical treatments, and enhance healthcare practices.
3. Physicians should immediately stop research involving human subjects if there are significant risks or harm to the participants, if the research protocol is not being followed, if there are unexpected adverse events, or if new information emerges that could affect the safety or ethical conduct of the study.
4. Research (human) subjects have several rights, including the right to informed consent, the right to privacy and confidentiality, the right to withdraw from the study at any time, the right to protection from harm or risks, and the right to have their well-being prioritized throughout the research process.
