If you're thinking of earning a degree and becoming a healthcare manager, you're surely wondering what your job prospects will be like after graduation. Are healthcare managers in demand? Where will I look for the best job in this field? Which skills will improve my employment outlooks for a medical administrator? These are the questions which are commonly asked by job seekers in healthcare management.

Demand for healthcare managers is currently growing at a fast rate. Experts at the Bureau of Labor Statistics plan to see 17% growth in the employment of healthcare managers in the United States by 2024. They attribute this to several factors. First and foremost, this is the aging of the generation of baby boomers. Their healthcare needs are significant. Thanks to more active lifestyles, they tend to live longer; many will have increased needs for nursing care facilities or hospital care.

The paychecks in this niche also show impressive growth in the recent past. In 2015, average annual <u>salaries for medical administrators</u> were \$94,500 per year. In 2016, those figures jumped up to \$96,540 annually. So, further growth is expected.

Hospitals tend to offer the best paying jobs in healthcare management. As of 2016, healthcare managers working as hospital staff were earning average annual paychecks of \$104,340.

Experts at the US Bureau of Labor Statistics also predict that there will be greater opportunities for administrators/managers of nursing care facilities.

A bachelor's degree is a necessary healthcare manager entry-level employment requirement. As you seek work in this field in the future, many of your competitors will have graduate degrees. It will be beneficial to earn your master's degree if you have the resources to do so. One of the most important trends affecting managers in healthcare right now is the change from manual medical record keeping to maintaining electronic health records. You can take advantage of this trend and distinguish yourself from other job candidates by acquiring computer expertise. Successful completing some coursework or perhaps even a minor in information technology will impress many potential healthcare employers. The knowledge you gain from your medical studies will probably be useful to you in your workday routine.

Healthcare management can be a rewarding choice of careers for individuals who demonstrate leadership ability and excellent interpersonal skills. If you think this occupation is one that will allow you to maximize your strengths, it's definitely a career path worth pursuing.
